Bring inspiration to your classroom with ByME Game Changers.

Each of these four dice features a key element of an active learning task. By rolling the dice, you can easily combine different concepts to design instant, engaging activities. It is your go-to tool for quick, creative teaching ideas.

How to play:

- 1. Roll:** Roll all 4 dice anytime you want to start a new activity in class.
- 2. Connect:** Look at the words on the top faces of the dice.
- 3. Inspire:** Combine the actions to create an instant, fun activity that gets your students thinking and talking.
- 4. Random:** If the dice shows the ByME logo you can roll it again, or make up your own action.

Teacher tips:

- There is no wrong combination.
- Use the dice as a starting point, then adapt the activity to your class, your students and your lesson objective.
- You don't have to use all the dice every time—feel free to use 2 or 3 to keep it flexible!

Quick examples for inspiration:

Challenge 1: Draw + Group + Find + Poster

Activity: In groups, students find three key ideas from the lesson, draw them on a simple poster, and explain how they connect to each other.

Challenge 2: Say + Pair + Guess + Picture

Activity: In pairs, students guess the subject or meaning of a picture and take turns to say a descriptive sentence about it. Be brave and speak only in English!
